## About these release notes

These release notes summarize the features of SMART Ink™ 1 for Windows® operating systems and Mac OS X operating system software.

## Product information

When you connect your computer and your SMART interactive product, you can use SMART Ink to write and draw in digital ink over open applications, files, folders, websites and any other open window on your computer.

When you write outside the open windows on your computer, a SMART Ink Note appears and you can write inside the note.

The SMART Ink Document Viewer enables you to view your PDF files on your Windows computer and to write in digital ink over your files.

- When you write on a PowerPoint® slide in Presentation mode, a red X won't appear on the screen and your SMART Ink notes and drawings will remain on the slide after you lift the pen from the screen.
- SMART Ink operates as expected when you update the firmware on your LightRaise™ interactive projector.

- When you're using multiple displays, changing from the Selection tool to a Pen tool on one display doesn't affect the tool that's selected on the other display.
- Objects in slides respond to touch as expected when you select them with a finger or a pen.
- The SMART Ink toolbar doesn't flash on your screen when you try to close or minimize Microsoft® Outlook®.
- You can use AVer software when SMART Ink is running.
- Animations in PowerPoint behave as expected when you write on the slide with SMART Ink and when you advance to the next slide.
- When you're using a SMART Board® V280 interactive whiteboard, the hand icon doesn't appear in the SMART Ink toolbar.
- You can play videos on [pearsonsuccessnet.com](http://pearsonsuccessnet.com) when you're running SMART Ink on Windows 7 operating systems.
- When you turn on or turn off SMART Ink, a black or white rectangle doesn't obstruct the toolbar or the ink.
- You can access online Help in Internet Explorer® 10 when SMART Ink is running.
- PowerPoint starts as expected after you install the SMART Ink plug-in for Microsoft Office.

#### **Mac operating system software**

- When you write on a PowerPoint slide in Presentation mode, your SMART Ink notes and drawings remain on the slide after you lift the pen from the screen.

#### General

- Memory performance is improved.
- An interpretation of your ink notes appears when you convert them to text.
- SMART Ink line widths are now consistent with other SMART software.
- You can select and then flick your ink notes to quickly move them to a new location.
- This release includes support for Urdu and Bengali.

#### Windows operating systems

- This release introduces SMART Ink Settings, which enables you to:
  - Specify whether SMART Ink starts when you log on.
  - Hide all SMART Ink toolbars until you pick up a pen and create digital ink notes. When you erase the ink notes, the toolbar disappears.
  - Set the opacity of the background of your SMART Ink Notes.
  - Specify whether drop shadows appear for your ink notes.
  - Select whether your ink notes disappear when you convert them to text.
  - Specify whether the SMART Ink toolbar for PowerPoint appears when you start a presentation.
  - Set the default orientation of the SMART Ink toolbar for PowerPoint as horizontal or vertical.
  - Specify whether SMART Ink is on by default when you start Microsoft Office.
- This release supports Windows 8 operating system in Desktop mode.
- When you select your ink notes, a menu appears that enables you to copy, cut and delete your ink notes.
- When you use SMART Notebook™ collaborative learning software in Transparent mode, SMART Ink is disabled.
- Collaboration using SMART Meeting Pro™ software with SMART Meeting Pro connector for Lync® is improved.
- When you write over tabs in Internet Explorer, your ink notes stay with the content on the page as you scroll it.
- When you drag and drop a tab in Google™ Chrome™ 1.4 or later or Internet Explorer 9 or later, your ink notes stay with the content on the tab.

- When you open a document that is missing functionality, a warning message appears.
- This release improves integration with Microsoft Office.
  - When you start a Microsoft Office application that includes its own ink tools, a message confirms that you're using Microsoft Office Pen tools.
  - A message confirms when you use the Microsoft Office Eraser tool.
  - A message appears when your version of Microsoft Office isn't activated, isn't supported by SMART Ink or isn't behaving as expected.
  - When you open a Microsoft Office document that's read-only or final, a message appears and you're unable to write or draw over the document.
  - If your interactive product supports multitouch, you can use gestures to navigate through PowerPoint slides.
  - The SMART Ink toolbar for PowerPoint is smaller. You can adjust the toolbar's transparency, and you can display it in horizontal or vertical view.

### **Mac OS X operating system software**

- This release includes supports for Mac OS X 10.8 operating system software and SMART GoWire™ auto-launch cables.
- When you use PowerPoint 2011, you're able to write in digital ink over your slides.
- You can convert your ink notes to text.

## About this release

This service pack for Windows operating systems is available if you're using SMART Notebook 11 collaborative learning software, SMART Meeting Pro 3.0 software or the SMART GoWire 3.0 for business auto-launch cable. It enables you to collaborate using SMART Meeting Pro software and Microsoft Lync software on your Windows computer.

## Resolved issues

- You can use Microsoft Lync software to share an application with a remote user. Previously, a blank screen appeared.
- You can use Microsoft Lync to share and stop sharing your desktop with a remote user regardless of whether your computer is connected to an interactive whiteboard.
- A remote user can use Microsoft Lync to write over an open Office window.
- SMART Ink doesn't slow down or stop when you use it for an extended period of time.
- When a remote user writes quickly on the desktop and then over a SMART Ink Note, a new SMART Ink Note appears.
- When you use a SMART GoWire for business auto-launch cable to connect to an interactive whiteboard, you can move the SMART Ink toolbar along the edge of your Office window.
- You can write or draw in Remote Ink when your operating system is set to any supported language.
- After you use SMART Meeting Pro software to reset the room, SMART Ink works as expected.
- When a remote user selects a different PowerPoint tool, Remote Ink works as expected. Previously, the first ink stroke disappeared.

- Dragging the bottom-right corner of a SMART Ink Note to resize it might work more slowly than expected.

- If SMART Ink isn't available in your language, the end user license agreement appears in English.

- If you remove SMART Ink or reinstall it and don't select the SMART Ink Document Viewer as the default PDF viewer, PDF files are no longer associated with a specific program.
