
You can use the SMART kapp iQ capture board to collaborate with others in a simple but powerful way.

Write and draw on the capture board as you would on a regular dry-erase board.

Writing notes on the kapp iQ board

You can write and erase notes on the capture board the same way you do on a traditional dry-erase board.

- Use the provided black pen to write or draw in black ink.
- Use the provided red pen to write or draw in red ink.
- For the best writing experience, be sure to hold the pen at a 90-degree angle.



- Make sure your hands, arms and any loose clothing don't touch the kapp iQ's surface as you write notes.
- The kapp iQ pens do not require batteries.




TIP: Two users can write or draw notes at the same time, one using the black pen and the other using the red pen.

Erasing notes on the kapp iQ board

You can erase notes on the capture board the same way you do on a traditional dry-drase board.

- Use the eraser end of either pen to erase notes.
- Use your palm or fist to erase notes.



 Make sure your hands, arms and any loose clothing don't touch the capture board's surface as you erase notes.

As you write additional notes or erase notes, the changes appear on your mobile device automatically.



Writing and erasing notes in the app

Contribute to the session, by writing in the kapp app. Your annotations appear on the connected SMART kapp iQ board.

To write or erase notes in the app:

- 1. Connect your mobile device to the capture board.
- 2. Press **Drawing Mode** .
- 3. Press the buttons on the bottom of the screen, and then write, erase, pan or zoom using your fingers.




4. Press **Done** to return to viewing mode.

Viewing notes on your mobile device

When your mobile device is connected to a capture board, you can view the notes you've written on the capture board on your mobile device. As you write or erase notes, the changes appear on your mobile device automatically.

By default, your mobile device displays the capture board's entire writing surface. You can use gestures to **zoom in**, **zoom out** and **pan**.





TIP: As you zoom in or out, grid lines appear on the writing surface to indicate the level of magnification.
