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This guide explains how to use SMART Ink® with your SMART interactive product.

About SMART Ink

You can use SMART Ink to write and draw in digital ink over open applications, files, folders, websites and any other open window on your computer. When you move, resize or minimize a window, the ink stays with the window.

You can write over each tab in Internet Explorer[®] and Chrome[™] Internet browsers or over a video without pausing it or interfering with the video's interactivity. You can highlight content on the screen and move, copy and paste and erase digital ink notes or convert them to text. You can also capture notes as an image and save the image in a SMART software file.

When you open Microsoft® Word, Excel® or PowerPoint® in Windows® operating systems, you can use the Microsoft ink tools to write in files.

About other SMART software

SMART Ink and SMART Product Drivers are included with SMART Notebook[®] collaborative learning software and SMART Meeting Pro[®] software.

SMART Product Drivers

SMART Product Drivers enables your computer to detect input from SMART interactive products.

SMART Ink works with SMART Product Drivers to give you the ability to write on the screen with the interactive product's pens using the drawing tools in the SMART Ink floating toolbar.

SMART Notebook software

SMART Notebook software is designed for education users.

Using your SMART interactive product's pens and the drawing tools in the SMART Ink floating toolbar, you can write in SMART Notebook software, and the digital ink becomes part of the SMART Notebook file.

SMART Meeting Pro software

SMART Meeting Pro software is designed for business users.

Using your SMART interactive product's pens and the drawing tools in the SMART Ink floating toolbar, you can write in SMART Meeting Pro software, and the digital ink becomes part of the SMART Meeting Pro file.

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Use SMART Ink to write and draw in digital ink.

Using the dynamic (floating) toolbar

Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar

Before opening the toolbar, connect your computer to a SMART interactive product and then start SMART Ink.

SMART Board interactive flat panels use Pen ID[™]. If you pick up a pen, the floating toolbar appears.



The toolbar changes color based on the most-recently picked up pen tool. If you pick up the black pen first, the toolbar will be black; if you then pick up the red pen, it will change to red.

Note

If the toolbar is currently expanded (i.e. someone has touched the floating toolbar center icon), the Ink software interprets this behavior as a potential change in pen properties, so even if other pens touch the board during this time, the center of the toolbar won't be updated.

Users can choose the colors and other settings for their pens independently.

The procedure for opening the toolbar depends on the type of SMART interactive product you're using.

Note

You can set the toolbar to appear on screen at all times (see *Chapter 5 Changing SMART Ink settings* on page 53).

Viewing the toolbar in full mode

When you first open the toolbar, it appears minimized. To view the toolbar in full mode, tap it.

Notes

• If SMART Notebook software is installed, buttons for the first four SMART Ink Favorites appear around the toolbar when it's minimized. These buttons are called "quick favorites" (see *Saving and using favorite tools* on page 24).



• The options available in full mode depend on the type of SMART interactive product connected to your computer.

The toolbar minimizes after 10 seconds of non-use. You can also minimize the toolbar at any time by pressing its center.

Moving and docking the toolbar

If the toolbar is covering content, drag it to a different part of the screen.

You can dock the toolbar to the left or right edge of the screen by dragging it to that edge. You can also tap the docking button in the top-right corner of the toolbar.

Pinning palettes in the toolbar

When you tap one of the buttons in the toolbar's circle, the button moves to the top of the circle and a palette for the button appears. After 10 seconds of non-use, the toolbar minimizes and open palettes disappear.

You can pin a palette so that it remains open while you write or draw or complete other tasks. To pin a palette, tap π in its upper-right corner. To unpin the palette, tap π in its top-right corner.

Note

If you tap the center of the toolbar, the toolbar minimizes and pinned palettes disappear.

Closing (hiding) the toolbar

Unless the toolbar is set to appear at all times (see *Chapter 5 Changing SMART Ink settings* on page 53), it disappears when you return the pen to its holder. If you pick up the pen later, the toolbar reappears in the same location.

You can also hide the toolbar in other ways:

- Dock the toolbar, push it off the screen until it disappears, and then tap **Close Ink** when prompted.
- Tap in the notification area (Windows operating systems) or Mac menu bar (OS X operating system software) and select **Hide Ink Toolbar**.

Note

You can also turn off SMART Ink for a specific window or application (see *Turning SMART Ink on or off* on page 37).

Getting started with the SMART Touch Inking Tool

SMART Notebook software required



If your computer is connected to a SMART interactive product that supports touch recognition, you can use the SMART Touch Inking Tool to write or draw with your finger or an accessibility aid, such as a tennis ball.

Note

The SMART Touch Inking Tool is available only if SMART Notebook software is installed.

Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool

You can start the SMART Touch Inking Tool in a variety of ways:

Operating system	Options
Windows	Select SMART Touch Inking Tool from the Windows Start menu.
	Note
	This procedure varies depending on the version of the Windows operating system you're using and your system preferences.
OSX	 Tap in the Mac menu bar, and then select Show SMART Touch Inking Tool.
	 Open the SMART Ink Settings window, tap Toolbar Settings, and then tap Start SMART Touch Inking Tool (see Changing settings in Mac operating system software on page 58).

Note

If the SMART Touch Inking Tool isn't available for your SMART interactive product, a message informs you when you try to open the tool.

Using the SMART Touch Inking Tool

After you start the SMART Touch Inking Tool, its floating toolbar appears. The SMART Touch Inking Tool toolbar is identical to the SMART Ink toolbar except that its circle is blue rather than gray (see *Using the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).



The SMART Touch Inking Tool toolbar lets you do everything that you can do with your SMART interactive product's pens and erasers, but with your finger or an accessibility aid, such as a tennis ball:

- Write, draw and erase
- Save digital ink in a screen capture
- Convert handwriting to typed text
- Save and use SMART Ink Favorites

Closing the SMART Touch Inking Tool

You can close the SMART Touch Inking Tool in a number of ways:

Operating system	Options
All	Dock the SMART Touch Inking Tool toolbar, push it off the screen until it disappears, and then tap Close Ink when prompted.
Windows	 Tap in the notification area, and then select Hide SMART Touch Inking Tool. Open the SMART Ink Settings window, tap Toolbar Settings, and then tap Close SMART Touch Inking Tool (see Changing settings in Windows operating systems on page 53).
OSX	 Tap in the Mac menu bar, and then select Hide SMART Touch Inking Tool. Open the SMART Ink Settings window, tap Toolbar Settings, and then tap Close SMART Touch Inking Tool (see Changing settings in Mac operating system software on page 58).

Note

You can also turn off the SMART Touch Inking Tool for a specific window or application (see *Turning SMART Ink on or off* on page 37).

Writing, drawing, and erasing

When you write or draw in an application or on the desktop, the digital ink becomes an object that you can erase, move and otherwise manipulate.

In addition to writing or drawing in various types of digital ink, you can write or draw in disappearing digital ink and draw spotlights, magnifiers and shapes.

Note

You can write in, draw in, erase and manipulate digital ink when SMART Ink is running (see *Using the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6) and your computer is connected to a SMART interactive product.

Writing and drawing in digital ink

You can write or draw in most applications and on the desktop.

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Note

If you are writing or drawing in a Microsoft Office application, see *Chapter 3 Using SMART Ink with Microsoft Office* on page 40.

To write or draw in digital ink

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating)* toolbar on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🗾.
- 3. Tap ***, and then select one of the following pens:

Note



¹The text pen behaves like the standard pen outside of SMART Notebook software.

4. Set the color and line properties for the pen:



5. Write or draw in digital ink.

Note

When you write or draw in digital ink on the desktop, the digital ink appears inside a SMART Ink Note. You can move and close the SMART Ink Note as you would any other window.

Using personal creative pens

If SMART Notebook software is installed, you can use photographs or other picture files to create personal creative pens.

To add a personal creative pen

- 1. Save the Bitmap, GIF, JPEG, PNG or TIFF picture file you want to use for a personal creative pen in a location you can access from the computer on which SMART Ink is installed.
- 2. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 3. Tap 🗹.
- 4. Tap "", and then select \mathscr{D} .

¹Presets, rather than color options, are available for the creative pen.

- 5. Tap
- 6. Tap # .

The Open dialog box appears.

7. Browse to the picture file you saved in step 1, and then tap **Open**.

SMART Ink adds a creative pen based on the picture file.

To delete a personal creative pen

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🖋.
- 3. Tap $^{\bullet\bullet}$, and then select \mathscr{A} .
- 4. Tap
- 5. Tap and hold the personal creative pen, and then tap **Delete**.

Writing and drawing in disappearing digital ink

If SMART Notebook software is installed, you can use the magic pen to write or draw in digital ink that disappears after a few seconds.

To write or draw in disappearing digital ink

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating)* toolbar on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).


- 2. Tap 🗹.
- 3. Tap $^{\bullet\bullet}$, and then select $\overset{*}{\mathcal{U}}_{\star}$.
- 4. Set the color and line thickness for the magic pen.

5. Write or draw in digital ink using the magic pen.

The digital ink disappears after a few seconds.

Drawing spotlights

If SMART Notebook software is installed, you can create a spotlight to highlight content on the screen. You do this by drawing a circle or oval using the magic pen.



To draw a spotlight

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🖋.
- 3. Tap $^{\bullet\bullet\bullet}$, and then select $\overset{\star}{\mathscr{D}}_{\bullet}$.
- 4. Set the color and line thickness for the magic pen.
- Draw a circle or oval around the portion of the screen you want to display using the magic pen.
 A spotlight appears.

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- 6. Optionally, press the spotlight's edge, and then drag outward or inward to make the spotlight larger or smaller.
- 7. When you're done with the spotlight, tap \blacksquare .

Tip

Alternatively, you can open the Spotlight tool from the toolbox (see *Using the Spotlight tool* on page 34).

Drawing magnifiers

If SMART Notebook software is installed, you can magnify content on the screen by drawing a square or rectangle with the magic pen.



To draw a magnifier

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🗹.
- 3. Tap $^{\bullet\bullet}$, and then select $^{*}\!\!\mathcal{D}_{\bullet}$.
- 4. Set the color and line thickness for the magic pen.
- 5. Use the magic pen to draw a square or rectangle around the portion of the screen you want to magnify.

A magnifier appears.


- 6. Optionally, do the following:
 - Tap within the magnifier and then drag to move it.
 - Tap the magnifier's edge, and then drag outward or inward to make the magnifier larger or smaller.
 - ° Drag the slider below the magnifier to zoom in and out.
- 7. When you're done with the magnifier, tap \blacksquare .

Tip

Alternatively, you can open the Magnifier tool from the toolbox (see *Using the Magnifier tool* on page 35).

Drawing shapes

If SMART Notebook software is installed, you can use the shape recognition pen to draw circles, ovals, squares, rectangles, triangles and arcs. SMART Ink converts your drawings to the appropriate shapes.



Note

In SMART Notebook software, the shapes are converted to SMART Notebook software objects. In other applications and on the desktop, the shapes remain digital ink.

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To draw a shape

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🗸.
- 3. Tap $^{\bullet\bullet\bullet}$, and then select \varnothing .
- 4. Set the color and line thickness for the shape recognition pen.
- 5. Draw a shape using the shape recognition pen.

If SMART Ink recognizes your drawing as a circle, oval, square, rectangle, triangle or arc, it converts the drawing to that appropriate shape.

Erasing

The procedure for erasing digital ink depends on the type of SMART interactive product that you're using:

Interactive product(s)	Procedure
Interactive displays	
SMART Board 7000	Move the eraser end of a pen over the digital ink you want to erase. OR Move your palm or fist over the digital ink you want to erase. OR Move the eraser over the digital ink you want to erase.
SMART Board 8000i-G5	Move the eraser end of a pen over the digital ink you want to erase. OR Move your palm or fist over the digital ink you want to erase.
SMART Board 8000i-G4 SMART Board 8000i-G3	Move the eraser over the digital ink you want to erase. OR Move your palm or fist over the digital ink you want to erase.
SMART Board 6000	Move the eraser end of a pen over the digital ink you want to erase. OR Move your palm or fist over the digital ink you want to erase.

Interactive product(s)	Procedure
SMART Board 4000	 Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar on page 6). OR Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool on page 9). Tap , and then select an eraser size. Move your finger over the digital ink you want to erase.
Interactive whiteboards	
SMART Board 800	Move the eraser over the digital ink you want to erase. OR Move your palm or fist over the digital ink you want to erase.
SMART Board M600	 Tap the Eraser button on the pen tray. OR Do the following: a. Open the toolbar in full mode (see page 6). b. Tap , and then select an eraser size. Move your finger over the digital ink you want to erase.
SMART Board 600	Move the eraser over the digital ink you want to erase. OR Move your palm or fist over the digital ink you want to erase.
Other interactive products	
LightRaise® 60wi2 LightRaise 60wi	 Open the SMART Ink toolbar in full mode (see page 6). Tap , and then select an eraser size. Move your finger over the digital ink you want to erase.
SMART Podium™	 Tap the Eraser button on the interactive pen display. Move the tethered pen over the digital ink you want to erase.

Writing, drawing or erasing at the same time as another user

On the following SMART interactive products, two users can write, draw and erase at the same time:

- SMART Board 7000 series interactive displays
- SMART Board 8000i-G5 series interactive flat panels
- SMART Board 8000i-G3 and 8000i-G4 series interactive flat panels
- SMART Board 6000 series interactive flat panels

- SMART Board 4000 series interactive flat panels
- SMART Board 800 series interactive whiteboards
- SMART Board M600 series interactive whiteboards
- LightRaise 60wi and 60wi2 interactive projectors

SMART Board 7000 series interactive displays, 6000 series and 8000i–G5 series interactive flat panels have Pen ID, which enables:

- Two users to specify colors and other settings for their pens independently on the 6000 series and 8000i-G5 series interactive flat panels.
- Four users to specify colors and other settings for their pens independently on the 7000 series interactive displays.


Manipulating digital ink

You can manipulate digital ink objects that you created with SMART Ink.

To select an object

Tap the object once.


A border appears around the object.



To select multiple objects

1. Tap the first object once.

A border appears around the object.




- 2. Tap on the border.
- 3. Drag a rectangle around the objects you want to select.

To select all objects

1. Tap the first object once.

A border appears around the object.



2. Tap the arrow $\overline{}$ on the border, and then select **Select All**.

To clear the selection of objects

Tap the arrow ▼ on the border, and then select **Select None**.

To move objects

- 1. Select the objects.
- 2. Drag the objects to a new location.

Tip

You can also flick the objects to move them quickly.

To cut or copy and then paste objects

- 1. Select the objects.
- 2. Tap the arrow \checkmark on the border, and then select **Cut** or **Copy**.
- 3. Paste the objects in another application.

To delete objects

- 1. Select the objects.
- 2. Tap on the border.

Tip

You can also erase digital ink to delete it (see *Erasing* on page 17).

Saving and clearing digital ink

Use the screen capture tool to save digital ink annotations, or clear all the annotations you made with SMART Ink.

Note

Screen capture support is available only if SMART Notebook software or SMART Meeting Pro software are installed on your computer.

After taking the screen capture, you can choose from a variety of actions:

- Send the screen capture to a new page in SMART Notebook software or SMART Meeting Pro software.
- Send the screen capture to the current page in SMART Notebook software.

Note

This option is available when SMART Notebook software is open.

- Save the screen capture as a PNG file to a folder named **Capture** on the desktop.
- Save the screen capture as a PNG file to a location of your choosing.
- Leave the screen capture on the clipboard to paste into any application.

You can clear digital ink from a window or SMART Ink Note after saving it.

Note

To take a screen capture or clear digital ink, start SMART Ink (see *Using the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6) and connect your computer to a SMART interactive product.

Taking screen captures

To take a screen capture using the Capture toolbar

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🚊 , and then tap 💁 .
- 3. Tap one of the following buttons:

Button	Description
<u> </u>	Capture a rectangular area.
曾	Capture a window.
(연)	Capture an entire screen.
<u>(a)</u> ()	Capture a freehand area.

4. Select the area, window or screen you want to capture.

The *Capture* window opens. This window displays a thumbnail of the screen capture and a button for the last action you selected.

5. Tap the last action's button.

OR

Tap **Do something else** and select a different action.

To take a screen capture using SMART Ink window tools

- 1. Write or draw digital ink over a window or on the desktop (see *Writing, drawing, and erasing* on page 10).
- 2. Tap the SMART Ink window tools button in the top-right corner of the window or SMART Ink Note, and then select **Capture Ink**.
 - The *Capture* window opens. This window displays a thumbnail of the screen capture and a button for the last action you selected.
- 3. Tap the last action's button.

OR

Tap **Do something else** and select a different action.

Clearing all digital ink from a window or SMART Ink Note

As an alternative to erasing digital ink, you can clear all digital ink from a window or SMART Ink Note.

To clear all digital ink from a window or SMART Ink Note

Tap ② in the upper-right corner of the window or the SMART Ink Note, and then select **Clear Ink**.

Notes

- ° In Internet Explorer and Chrome for Windows , this procedure clears digital ink from the current tab. Digital ink in other tabs is not affected.
- In Chrome for macOS a software, this procedure clears digital ink from all tabs in the Chrome window.

Converting handwriting to typed text

You can write in digital ink and then convert the writing to text. For example, you can write over a browser and then insert the ink as text in the browser's search field.

Note

You can convert handwriting to text outside of SMART software when SMART Ink is running (see *Using the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6) and your computer is connected to a SMART interactive product.

To convert new handwriting

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

2. Tap , and then tap .

The text conversion window appears.

3. Write the characters you want to convert to text in the text conversion window.

As you write, the text conversion window converts your handwriting to text.

Notes

- ° To display an on-screen keyboard, tap 🕮.
- ° To remove existing text from the text conversion window, tap .
- ° To edit text, use the editing marks in the bottom left corner of the text conversion window.
- 4. If you want to insert the text in the application, tap ✓, and then tap where you want to insert the text.

OR

If you don't want to insert the text in the application, tap X.

To convert existing handwriting

- 1. Select the handwriting you want to convert.
- 2. Tap non the border.

A message appears asking you to touch where you want to insert this text, and your converted writing appears.

3. Tap the location in an application where you want to insert the text.

Your notes appear in the application as text.

Saving and using favorite tools

SMART Notebook software required

1

You can save pens, stamps, and tools as SMART Ink Favorites for easy access.

Notes

- SMART Ink Favorites are available only if SMART Notebook software is installed on your computer.
- To use SMART Ink Favorites, start SMART Ink (see *Using the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6) and connect your computer to a SMART interactive product.

Using favorite pens

If you frequently write or draw in the same color, width and style of digital ink, you can save those properties as a favorite pen.

To add a favorite pen

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🛣.
- 3. Tap 🛨, and then select **Pen**.
- 4. Select a favorite pen type.
- 5. Set the favorite pen's properties.
- 6. Tap Add as favorite.

To edit a favorite pen

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🖈.
- 3. Tap Edit.
- 4. Select the favorite pen, and then tap Customize Pen.

- 5. Change the favorite pen's properties.
- 6. Tap **Save**.

To delete a favorite pen

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🛣.
- 3. Tap Edit.
- 4. Select the favorite pen, and then tap **Delete**.
- 5. Tap Done.

To write or draw in digital ink using a favorite pen

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

2. Select a quick favorite by pressing it.

OR

Tap $\stackrel{\wedge}{\Box}$, and then select the favorite pen.

Note

If you're using a SMART Board interactive flat panel and the SMART Touch Inking Tool is not available, the toolbar is used in full mode to access the *Favorites* button.

3. Write or draw in digital ink.

Using favorite stamps

If you frequently use a stamp from the stamp pad, you can save the stamp as a favorite stamp.

To add a favorite stamp

1. Open SMART Ink's dynamic (floating) toolbar in full mode (see *Opening the dynamic (floating)* toolbar on page 6).

OR

Open the SMART Touch Inking Tool dynamic toolbar in full mode (see *Starting the SMART Touch Inking Tool* on page 9).

- 2. Tap 🖈.

The stamp pad comes with ten standard stamps. You can also create your own personal stamps.





Turning SMART Ink on or off

You can use SMART Ink to write or draw on most windows. However, there may be times where you wish to turn off SMART Ink. You can turn off SMART Ink in the following ways:

Turn off SMART Ink temporarily for all windows/applications If you don't need to use SMART Ink, you can disable it until the next time you restart or log in to the computer.

Tip

If you want to leave SMART Ink on, but hide the dynamic (floating) toolbar, see Closing (hiding) the toolbar on page 8.

a specific window

Turn off SMART Ink for If you want to turn off SMART Ink for a specific application window, use this option.

Turn off SMART Ink permanently for an application

This is particularly useful when an application has its own writing and drawing tools (for example, Microsoft Word or PowerPoint) that you want to use instead of SMART Ink.

Note

SMART Ink is for use with an interactive product. If the computer on which SMART Ink is installed is not connected to an interactive product, such as a SMART Board, you cannot use SMART Ink.

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Turning off SMART Ink

To turn off SMART Ink temporarily for all windows and applications

- 1. Tap in the notification area (Windows operating systems) or Mac menu bar (OS X operating system software) and select **SMART Settings**.
- 2. Tap SMART Ink Settings.
- 3. Confirm the **Start SMART Ink when you log on** box is selected.
- 4. Tap Turn Off SMART Ink.

Note

SMART Ink is still available in SMART Notebook or Meeting Pro software.

To turn off SMART Ink for a window

1. Write or draw in the window (see Writing, drawing, and erasing on page 10).

Note

To turn off SMART Ink for a window or an application, start SMART Ink (see *Using the dynamic (floating) toolbar* on page 6) and connect your computer to a SMART interactive product.

- 2. Tap in the top-right corner of the window, and then select **Turn off SMART Ink**. The *Turn off SMART Ink* dialog box appears.
- 3. Tap In this window.
- 4. Writing or drawing with SMART Ink no longer works in the window.

To turn off SMART Ink for an application

- 1. Write or draw in the window (see Writing, drawing, and erasing on page 10).
- 2. Tap in the top-right corner of the application, and then select **Turn off SMART Ink**. The *Turn off SMART Ink* dialog box appears.

3. Tap In this application.

Writing or drawing with SMART Ink no longer works in the application.

(!) Important

This is a permanent change. If you turned off SMART Ink for an application by accident, you can turn it back on. For more information, see *Enabling SMART Ink on specific applications* (community.smarttech.com/s/article/Enabling-SMART-Ink-on-specific-applications).

Turning on SMART Ink manually

By default, SMART Ink starts when you first log on to your computer. However, if SMART Ink isn't set up to start automatically, you can start it manually.

After SMART Ink starts, you can open the SMART Ink dynamic (floating) toolbar and use it to write and draw, convert handwriting to text, take screen captures and use favorites.

Using the SMART Ink plugin for Adobe Acrobat Reader

If you installed SMART Ink on a computer with Adobe Reader XI or Adobe Acrobat Reader DC, you can use the SMART Ink plugin for Adobe Acrobat Reader to write or draw in PDF files.

Tip

To confirm that the SMART Ink plugin is installed, go to Adobe Acrobat Reader and select **Help > About Third-Party Plug-Ins > About SMART Ink plugin**.

Writing in, drawing in and erasing digital ink

With Adobe Acrobat Reader and the SMART Ink plugin, you can write in, draw in and erase digital ink in PDF files. The SMART Ink plugin inserts digital ink in the PDF file as Adobe Acrobat Reader comments.

To write or draw in a PDF file

1. Open the PDF file in Adobe Acrobat Reader.

Note

If the author has restricted editing of the PDF file, a message appears. Ask the author to permit editing of the PDF file so that you can write or draw in it.

2. Use your SMART interactive product's pen and the SMART Ink floating toolbar to write or draw in the PDF file (see *Writing, drawing, and erasing* on page 10).

To erase digital ink in a PDF file

Use your SMART interactive product's eraser, your palm, your fist or the SMART Ink floating toolbar to erase digital ink in the PDF file (see *Writing, drawing, and erasing* on page 10).

Labeling digital ink

You can label digital ink in situations where more than one person is writing or drawing in a PDF file. You can also use labels to differentiate digital ink notes. For example, in an architectural drawing, you could distinguish notes related to electrical systems from those related to plumbing systems.

To create a label

- 1. Open the PDF file in Adobe Acrobat Reader.
- 2. Pick up your SMART interactive product's pen.
- 3. Click ...
- 4. Tap #.

The text conversion window appears.

5. Write the text for the label in the text conversion window.

As you write, the text conversion window converts your handwriting to text.

- ° To display an on-screen keyboard, tap 🕮.
- $^{\circ}$ To remove existing text from the text conversion window, tap \mathscr{C} .
- ° To edit text, use the editing marks in the bottom left corner of the text conversion window.

To label digital ink

To use the troubleshooting tab

1. If the floating toolbar is open, tap 🔯 in the toolbar's lower-right corner.

OF

If the toolbar isn't open, select **SMART Ink Settings** in the Windows Start menu.

Note

This procedure may vary depending on your version of Windows operating system and your system preferences.

The SMART Ink Settings window appears.

2. Tap Troubleshooting.

SMART Ink verifies the following:

- Is SMART Ink running?
- Is your computer connected to a SMART interactive product?
- o Does your version of Windows operating system have inking tools?
- o Does your version of Microsoft Office have inking tools?
- Are the SMART Ink plug-ins for PowerPoint, Word and Excel enabled (see Troubleshooting the SMART Ink plug-ins for Microsoft Office on page 63)?

If SMART Ink identifies an issue with any of the above points, it displays a red X beside the point and provides information about resolving the issue.

3. Follow the on-screen instructions to resolve any issues.

Turning on Tablet PC components

Windows operating systems only



To enable all features of SMART Ink in Microsoft Office applications, turn on Tablet PC components. This procedure varies depending on your version of Windows operating system.

To turn on Tablet PC components in Windows 7 operating system

1. Select Start > Control Panel.

The Control Panel appears.

- 2. Select **Category** in the *View by* drop-down list.
- 3. Tap Programs, and then tap Turn Windows features on or off.

The Windows Features dialog box appears.

You might be prompted to provide an administrator password or confirmation.

- 4. Scroll to and select the Tablet PC Components check box.
- 5. Tap **OK**.

To turn on Tablet PC components in Windows 8.1 operating system

Troubleshooting the SMART Ink plug-ins for Microsoft Office

If the SMART Ink plug-ins for Microsoft Office aren't installed or working correctly, complete the following troubleshooting steps:

- 1. Ensure the Tablet PC components are turned on (see *Turning on Tablet PC components* on page 61).
- 2. If the Tablet PC components are turned on but the SMART Ink plug-ins are still not working correctly, make sure the SMART Ink plug-ins are enabled (see *Enabling the SMART Ink plug-ins* below).
- 3. If the SMART Ink plug-ins are enabled but are still not working correctly, repair the SMART Ink plugins (see *Repairing the SMART Ink plug-ins* on the next page).
- 4. If the SMART Ink plug-ins are repaired but are still not working correctly, ask your system administrator to reinstall SMART Ink.

Repairing the SMART Ink plug-ins

- 4. Select **SMART Ink** in the list, and then tap **Repair**.

The SMART Ink plug-in installation wizard appears.

To repair the plug-ins in Windows 8.1 operating system

1. Go to the *Apps* screen, and then scroll to and tap **Control Panel**.

The Control Panel appears.

- 2. Select **Category** in the *View by* drop-down list.
- 3. Tap Uninstall a program.
- 4. Select **SMART Ink** in the list, and then tap **Repair**.

The SMART Ink plug-in installation wizard appears.

5. Follow the on-screen instructions.

To repair the plug-ins in Windows 10 operating system

- 1. Type programs in the task bar search box, and then select **Programs and Features**.
 - The Control Panel appears.
- 2. Select **SMART Ink** in the list, and then tap **Repair**.
 - The SMART Ink plug-in installation wizard appears.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Use the plug-in for PowerPoint after restarting your computer

After a computer restart, SMART Ink can take longer to start up than PowerPoint. If you try to use the SMART Ink plug-in for PowerPoint immediately after you restart your computer, SMART Ink may not work correctly. When using SMART Ink in PowerPoint, follow these steps:

- 1. At computer start-up, wait for all of your computer's start-up programs to complete. This may take several minutes.
- 2. Open PowerPoint. The SMART Ink Toolbar for PowerPoint should appear.
- 3. Try using SMART Ink. If it does not behave as expected, close PowerPoint and wait a little longer for SMART Ink to start up.
- 4. Open PowerPoint again and use SMART Ink.

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
